Job Purpose

- Support teaching and learning activities for pupils in Key Stage 1, working both with individuals and small groups under the direction of teaching staff.
- Provide welfare support for pupils during the school day, ensuring their safety and well-being.
- Support a pupil with social, emotional, and mental health needs and Autism, helping them to build trusting relationships, develop self-confidence, and gain independence in self-emotional regulation, enabling them to access learning and maximise their potential.

Role and responsibilities

1. Main duties and responsibilities

The successful postholder will:

- Assist the class teacher in delivering learning activities, adapting materials and resources to meet pupils' needs.
- Support pupils with a range of needs, including those with social, emotional and mental health (SEMH) needs, to participate fully in classroom and school life.
- Build positive relationships with pupils to encourage engagement, motivation and self-esteem.
- Provide one-to-one and small group support for pupils as directed.
- Help pupils develop independence and self-regulation strategies in managing their emotions and behaviour.
- Monitor and record pupils' progress and report to the class teacher and SENCO as required.
- Supervise and support pupils during break and lunchtime periods as a Welfare Assistant, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment.
- Promote positive behaviour in line with the school's behaviour policy.
- Assist with the personal care and welfare of pupils as needed.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues to contribute to the school's inclusive and nurturing ethos.

Safeguarding

To be aware of and work in accordance with the Trust's child protection policies and procedures in order to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and young people and to raise any concerns relating to such procedures which may be noted during the course of duty.

In common with all staff and pupils of the Trust, the post holder should be aware of the Trust's policies and implement them as appropriate.

The Trust is required under law and guidance to check the criminal background of all employees. Nothing shall prevent you from disclosing information which you are entitled to disclose under the Public Interest Disclosure Act 1998 (as amended), provided the disclosure is made in accordance with the provisions of the Act. - Undertake a systematic study of practice with a consequent programme of self and professional development to ensure that the necessary skill, knowledge and understanding are kept up to date.
- Be aware of and comply with all school policies (available via the Staff VLE). It is important that all staff
 keep up to date with current policies and any concerns are reported to the relevant named persons
 without delay.
- To promote equality, diversity and inclusion and demonstrate this within the role.
- To play a full part in the life of the school community, to support its distinctive mission, aims and the ethos.
- To set an example of positive personal integrity and professionalism with appropriate communications and relationships at all levels.
- To undertake such other duties which may be regarded as within the nature of the duties and responsibilities for the grade of the post as defined and subject to any reasonable adjustments under the Equality Act 2010. Any changes of a permanent nature will be incorporated into the job description.
