## ~ ADMISSIONS ~

At Farnborough Road Schools we follow Sefton LEA guidance for admissions, a copy of which can be obtained from the Admissions Department of Children, Schools & Families who will also deal with any queries you may have. Tel : 0151-934-3131.

### **NURSERY ADMISSIONS**

#### **Caterpillar Class- 2 Year Old Nursery**

Children can be admitted to our 2 year old provision in the term following their second birthday in our purpose built room designed with both an indoor and outdoor learning space. We can provide funded or paid places up to 15 hours per week. Our 3 hour a day sessions are charged at £20 per session.

#### **Butterflies and Ladybirds Classes -3 Year Old Nursery**

Nursery places are also available in our 3-4 year old provision in the term following their third birthday. Children admitted can receive 30 hours or 15 hours free education in our high quality school nursery environment. Additional sessions can be added at £20 per session and £5 for lunch. An additional day can be added at a cost of £45 per day.

All our 2 year old and 3 year old nursery children have access to the excellent facilities in the Infant school and join the rest of the school for special events throughout the school year.

Places in our nursery provisions are allocated on a first come, first served basis and we highly recommend completing an expression of interest form on the Infant school website as soon as possible as the spaces are limited and very popular within our community. ### **INFANT & JUNIOR SCHOOL ADMISSIONS**

By law, children become school age at the beginning of the term after their fifth birthday, but in practice, the great majority of children start school before that date. At Farnborough Road we admit all our pupils in September at the beginning of the new school year. These are pupils who will have their fifth birthday between the 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> August that academic year.

Sefton Metropolitan Borough Council (The Local Authority) coordinate **all** applications for school places for **all** schools for children resident in Sefton (except for Special Schools and Independent Schools).

Parents with children of statutory school age who move into Sefton and require a school place outside of the normal transfer times should apply for a school place using the official application form. The **A1 application form** is only available through the Sefton Schools Admissions Section. (It can be downloaded online at [www.sefton.gov.uk/schooladmissions](http://www.sefton.gov.uk/schooladmissions))

The Headteacher welcomes all prospective parents and pupils to visit the school before admission. Please telephone the school office to make an appointment.

Parents are welcome to call into the Infant school office to put their child's name down for a Nursery and/or school place from the child's second birthday onwards.

### **ACCESSIBILITY**

Arrangements are in place for the admission of pupils with additional needs. Please contact either Headteacher to discuss this further.

## ~ FARNBOROUGH ROAD SCHOOLS ORGANISATION ~



### SCHOOL STRUCTURE:

#### NURSERY

Our 2 year old Caterpillar Nursery is organised into 2 part time classes. Children can attend in the morning or afternoon for up to 5 sessions.

Our 3 year old Nursery is organised into 1 full time 30 hour class and 2 part time 15 hour classes. Additional sessions can be added as well as wrap around provision from 7.45am until 6pm.

Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

#### INFANT SCHOOL

Our Infant school consists of 2 Key Stages; The Early Years Foundation Stage (2-5 years old) and Key Stage One (5-7 year olds). We have 12 infant classes, 4 in each year group.

Each class has a full time Teacher and Teaching Assistant.

#### JUNIOR SCHOOL

The Junior School is organised into 16 classes, 4 in each year group. Teaching staff are deployed in a balanced team of curriculum strengths with one member acting as a year group leader.

As well as Teachers, both schools employ a considerable number of non-teaching staff who support the schools in a variety of roles.

## ~ PASTORAL CARE ~

We take the care of the children very seriously. Each teacher is responsible for the welfare of the children within his/her own class. Each year group has a Year Leader who is responsible for all issues linked to that year group. The Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher have overall responsibility for the pastoral care of all the children.

Parents will be asked to complete, an Emergency Contact Form, which supplies details of daytime addresses, telephone numbers, helpful relatives or friends and the family GP. These are vital pieces of information in the event of there being a problem during school hours and failure to return these forms could result in valuable time being lost and a child suffering needlessly. Any changes of address, etc. should be notified to the school at the earliest opportunity.

Children from Year 3 to Year 6 will have a school Planner, which contains important information. This Planner is the main form of contact between home and school.

Children required to stay at school after 3.20 p.m. require parental consent and forms will be sent home prior to the event. If for any reason, an after school club is cancelled, then notice will always be given.

Parents are respectfully asked to inform school if there is anything happening outside school which adversely affects their child within school.

We pride ourselves on the pastoral support available through our staff team and the Rainbow Room is a resource that is highly valued by every member of our school community. If you are worried about your child, please make contact with school and we will try to help.

## ~ THE CURRICULUM ~

### KEY STAGE 2: JUNIORS - YEARS 3,4,5 & 6

Through the full use of the National Curriculum and the provision of a wide variety of extra curricular activities we aim to develop each individual while inculcating a love of the learning process.

We teach each of the National Curriculum Core subjects of Maths, English and Science, the six Foundation Subjects, Environmental Education, Health Education and Religious Education. We organise our curriculum into topics, with each year group having three topics each year.

Although we stress the importance of Maths and English in the Curriculum, we value the other subjects to give all the children the opportunity to develop their other skills. We pride ourselves by providing a broad and balanced Curriculum to enhance the learning opportunities of all our children. Full details of our curriculum offer can be found on our school website.

## ~ RELIGIOUS EDUCATION ~

We aim to help the children understand the nature, beliefs and practices of religions helping to develop a tolerance for other people, both in the way they live and their beliefs. We follow the Sefton curriculum and guidance for religious education. Our daily acts of worship have a mainly Christian character though not distinctive of any denomination.

If, however, a parent requests that a pupil be wholly or partly excused from attendance at religious worship or religious education (or both) in school, he/she shall be so excused if the request is made in writing, and the pupils will be accommodated on the premises during the periods of withdrawal.

## ~ PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH & CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION (PSHCE) ~ Including Sex Education

The Governors recognise the importance of parents as key figures in helping children cope with the problems of growing up. They are aware also that some parents do not feel able to discuss sexual matters freely with their children and that this places a special responsibility on schools to see that pupils are adequately prepared for adult life. Both schools deliver the SEAL (Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning) programme.

In the Infant school PSHCE is linked to topic work. Young children are interested in their individual rate of development and are curious about their bodies. This enables teachers to provide, in an interesting way, a major factual input and forge cross curricular links with other areas. Children learn about themselves, food relationships and safety.

In the Juniors, sex education is a recurring theme through all years of our Health Education programme.

The introduction of the subject of human reproduction occurs in Year 5, the first step being a parents evening at which the curriculum content is shown.

Parents wishing to withdraw their children on moral or religious grounds may do so in writing.



## ~ LEARNING SUPPORT / SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS ~

Farnborough Road Junior School is an inclusive school, where children are valued, respected and welcomed. We seek to support all children in their learning and development and ensure they have equal access to all areas of school life.

We comply with the statutory requirements laid out in the SEND Code of Practice 0-25 (2014) and have a whole school approach to the early identification of Special Educational Needs so that appropriate provision can be made to meet the needs of individual pupils and remove barriers to learning. Differentiated planning and graded approach to provision means that pupils with Special Educational Needs have the opportunity to access the full national curriculum and become independent learners.

The school works with a number of different outside agencies such as Inclusion Consultants, the Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapists, Physiotherapists, the school nurse and CAMHS who are able to provide us with more specialist support and guidance when needed.

We believe that the relationship between parents of children with Special Educational Needs and the school has a crucial impact on the child's educational progress and the effectiveness of any school based action. We therefore aim to develop an effective working relationship with parents and we have an 'open door' policy so that concerns can be discussed at any time.



# GUIDANCE FOR WEEKLY HOMEWORK

In general, children in school will receive the following homework

## Want more?

Some families like more activities for their children at home. Each Year group will provide a list of **possible activities linked to their topics** that you may like to consider. These are optional but will extend a child's learning.

## Recording of Homework

Homework will be recorded as follows:-

- Reading - This should be recorded in the school planner and a parent should sign that this has been completed
- Spellings - There will be a list in the planner each week
- Sumdog - Online activity
- Times Table Rockstars - Online activity
- Other Maths and English - This will be worksheet based but sent and returned via Dojo in the vast majority of cases

## Expectations

We expect homework to be completed every week by all children.

Teachers will keep a record of children who DO NOT complete homework activities and work with their child and their family to resolve this. It is the class teacher's responsibility to resolve this in the first instance.

School will provide homework clubs for children who cannot complete their tasks at home.

With children who refuse to complete their activities, despite extensive support, we will use the school behaviour policy as appropriate to make sure that every child participates.



## ~ BEHAVIOUR ~

At Farnborough Road Schools, we hope that our children will develop an awareness of self and a set of moral values. We expect them to develop habits of self-discipline and acceptable behaviour to help them towards independence, self-esteem and self-motivation. Every child's contribution to our community is important.

For parents' convenience in the Infants we provide a separate booklet outlining the school policy on behaviour when children first start school. The Behaviour Policy for the Junior School is available on the school website.

Our school policy on bullying is to deal promptly with any instances. All cases of bullying will be reported immediately to parents. The appropriate action will be taken to keep the victim safe and the bully will be punished.

## ~ PARENTS AS PARTNERS ~

We acknowledge that parents are the child's first educators and try to provide opportunities to enable parents to feel involved with their child's learning. These opportunities include Pre-Nursery visits, formal and informal parents' evenings and workshops, invitations to concerts and other special events. Parents of children in the Infants will receive a termly curriculum news letter which informs them of work and activities being covered in classes each term.

Parents are always welcome in the school grounds, delivering and collecting their child/children. If you need to talk to the teacher, it will be most helpful if you could avoid the '9 o'clock rush', when teachers are very busy. If you wish to see a member of staff after school, please make an appointment for a mutually convenient time. In the Infants we have members of staff at the school doors to take any messages you may have for the class teacher. Children in the Juniors are given a Pupil Planner which provides a considerable amount of useful information about school life. In addition, we use it as the main form of communication between home and school.

We are always looking for help in the classrooms. Please contact the class teacher to discuss any support you can offer (a DBS may be required but the school office will be glad to assist you with this). We are also very grateful for offers of help from parents to accompany school trips.

The Infant School runs courses for parents throughout the school year to aid parents understanding of their child's education and to enable parents to support their learning.



## ~ COMPLAINTS ~

If you have a concern or complaint we would like you to tell us about it. We welcome suggestions for improving the work of the school. Be assured that whatever you want to tell us, our support and respect for you and your child in the school will not be affected in any way. Please tell us of your concerns as soon as possible, delay in doing so can make it difficult for us to investigate properly an incident or problem which has happened some time ago. A copy of our parents' complaint procedure can be obtained from the school website.

## ~ CHILD PROTECTION ~

Parents should be aware that the school will take any reasonable action to ensure the safety of its pupils/students. In cases where the school has reason to be concerned that a child may be subject to ill-treatment, neglect or other forms of abuse, staff have no alternative but to follow Borough Child Protection Procedures and inform Social Services of their concern.

Parents will not always be fully informed of concerns unless staff are certain that the safety of the child will not be prejudiced by their doing so.

## ~ EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES ~

We place an emphasis on extra curricular activities to enhance the curriculum for our children and provide them with access to a wider range of experiences. We are a lead school for Children's University (CU) in Sefton. CU gives pupils credits for learning outside the normal school day and our school clubs are linked to this scheme. Many activities outside school have also been validated for Children's University and children can record credits on a CU Passport which is available for a small cost. If a child receives enough credits whilst in the Juniors they will "graduate" during Year 6 at a ceremony at a local university. A full list of extra curricular activities provided in the Junior school can be obtained from the Junior school office or from the school website.



## BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL PROVISION

A before and after school club, run by Fun4Kidz, is also held on the school site from 7.45am in the morning, and up to 6.00pm after school. A holiday club is also available.

**ATTENDANCE** - We expect prompt and regular attendance by all our pupils. We ask that children do not arrive on the yards until 8.40am. Children who do arrive late must access school through the school office and be signed in (if an adult is accompanying them.)

The school operates a 'First Day Response' system for pupil absence. If your child is to be absent from school you should report the absence via email (absence@frjs.co.uk) by 9.00am giving the reason. If we have not heard from you by this time, we will text parents reminding them to contact school. This important policy is in place to help guarantee the children's safety and we would ask that you continue to help us to enforce this .

**HOLIDAYS** - Following changes to Government legislation regarding holidays in term time, Head teachers **are no longer able to authorise absence requests for family holidays.**

Every moment in school counts and days missed add up quickly. Evidence shows that pupils who have good attendance enjoy better wellbeing and school attainment.

There are only a few circumstances where a child is allowed to miss school, such as illness or where the school has given permission because of an exceptional circumstance. However, if your child misses school without a good reason, local councils and schools can intervene and you may be issued a fine.

The Government have legislated to introduce a new national framework which will mean all councils have the same rules in place for when they need to consider a fine.

Currently, it is the responsibility of the local authority to decide when to issue fines to parents, meaning the process varies from council to council. However, under the new national framework, all schools will be required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons.

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be **£80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.** In the case of repeated fines, if a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160. Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500.

The Farnborough Road Schools have always had good attendance records and we are proud of our relationships with families in the local community. We hope all parents understand the school has to follow legislation and that you will continue to support us in this matter.

**SCHOOL VISITS** - The children undertake several educational visits during the year as part of their curriculum and topic work. Parents/Guardians will be notified in advance and asked to sign a consent form, without which we cannot allow the children to participate. The school will not be able to provide these valuable and stimulating activities without voluntary contributions towards the cost from parents.

**MEDICINES IN SCHOOL** - Please inform the school office of any medical conditions which may affect your child during the school day. It is particularly important that we are aware of long term conditions such as asthma and allergies so that a care plan can be written for your child and that the appropriate medication is kept securely in school.

If your child is prescribed medicine for a short term condition (ie antibiotics), the office staff can administer this if the dose is 4 times daily. (If 3 times per day this can be given at home before and after the school day). Medicine must be taken directly to the school office by a parent/carer (NOT given to your child or your child's teacher). You will need to sign a form giving details of the medicine and your consent. Under no circumstances should any medication be given to children to keep in their bag/class to use during the day (including throat lozenges etc.)

Please note: - School CANNOT administer "over the counter" medication such as Calpol or Paracetamol but parents can call into school to give these if required.

**DOGS** - Dogs are not permitted onsite. Parents are respectfully asked not to walk or carry their dog onto the premises. Dogs are only permitted as part of a curriculum activity with a full risk assessment.

**CYCLING TO SCHOOL** - Children are welcome to come to school on bicycles. In the interests of Health & Safety, pupils **MUST NOT** ride bicycles and scooters in the school grounds. Helmets must be worn and we advise the use of bicycle locks in our cycle stands.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Cycles are parked at school at the owner's risk. We cannot accept responsibility for lost or damaged cycles.



## **SCHOOL MEALS**

Children in our school normally stay for lunch. They can choose (on a daily basis) whether to bring a packed lunch or have a school meal. Some children may be eligible for free school meals and we would ask that you contact the school office if you have any questions about this service.

Children who have a school dinner enjoy a cashless "cafeteria" style system where they can make their own choices for lunch from a range of healthy and nutritious foods, including the meal of the day. Payment must be made in **advance** - this can be made using our **ParentPay** system (you will be given a letter explaining how to use this which will include a unique Username and Password). Please see separate letter regarding School Meals.

## **FRIENDS OF FARNBOROUGH ROAD**

We have a thriving "Friends" Association, who organise events for the children as well as social events for parents and friends. We welcome help with the "Friends" Association as well as parental help in the school.

The Friends provide the school with resources to pay for all the extras that make life so much better for all the children of the school. Recently, the Friends have subsidised the costs of trips for all pupils across the school and paid for visiting speakers and theatre groups. New members are always welcome to join the group as we are always looking for new ideas.

## **PRIVACY NOTICE - HOW WE COLLECT, STORE AND SHARE STUDENT INFORMATION (DATA PROTECTION ACT 1998 AND GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION 2018)**

As part of the **General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)**, which comes into effect in May 2018, we are required to review our current practice and implement new processes where required. To ensure compliance we are required to explain to parents what data we keep and how we use it.

Farnborough Road Junior School processes personal data about its pupils and is a 'data controller' in respect of this for the purposes of the Data Protection Act 1998 and the General Data Protection Regulation.

We collect and hold personal information relating to our pupils and may also receive information about them if they join Farnborough Road Junior School from another setting, from the local authority and/or the Department for Education (DfE).

## **DISABILITY**

Please tell us if there are any adjustments we need to make to help you support your child, for example: letters in large font or Braille, explaining things over the phone rather than by letter, wheelchair access.

**WATER BOTTLES** - We ask that children only bring FRJS water bottles to school. All Junior school children will be given a free water bottle on their first day in September.

**HAIRSTYLES** -The school does not permit extreme fashion hairstyles such as tramlines, decorative shaving, Mohicans or beaded hair. Extreme use of colour is also not allowed in school. Long hair on girls and boys should **ALWAYS** be tied back.

**FOOTWEAR** - Sensible footwear should be worn in school at all times to maintain standards of health and safety. Only footwear with a heel of 3cm or below is permitted. Open toes sandals are not permitted at any time.

**EARRINGS** -The Governors recommend, for safety reasons, that earrings should not be worn for school, but where a child already has pierced ears, only small stud earrings are suitable. These earrings must be removed by the child before he/she will be allowed to take part in any P.E., Swimming or Games lessons. Newly pierced ears must be covered with plasters before participation in sport sessions, **but earrings MUST be removed for swimming lessons.**

**PERSONAL BELONGINGS** - No other jewellery, apart from a watch, may be worn in school. Whilst all reasonable care will be taken of the children's personal property, neither the school nor local authority can take responsibility for any loss or damage. Children should not bring valuable personal items to school as we cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to such items. Mobile phones are **not permitted** in school under any circumstances.
