General

Teachers act with honesty and integrity; have strong subject knowledge, keep their knowledge and skills as teachers up-to-date and are self-critical, forge positive professional relationships and work with parents in the best interests of their pupils.
Main Purpose of the Role
To teach across the age and ability range of Key Stage 3, Key Stage 4 and Sixth Form as applicable. You will also be required to teach additional subjects within the timetable.
Personal and Professional Conduct
A teacher is expected to demonstrate consistently high standards of personal and professional conduct. The following statements define the behaviour and attitudes which set the required standard for conduct throughout a teacher's career. Teachers uphold public trust in the profession and maintain high standards of ethics and behaviour, within and outside school by: • Treating pupils with dignity, building relationships always rooted in mutual respect and observing proper boundaries appropriate to a teacher's professional position. • Having regard for the need to safeguard pupils' well-being in accordance with statutory provisions. • Showing tolerance of and respect for the rights of others. • Not undermining fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect, and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. • Ensuring that personal beliefs are not expressed in ways which exploit pupils' vulnerability or might lead them to break the law. Teachers must have proper and professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school in which they teach and maintain high standards in their own attendance and punctuality. Teachers must understand, and always act within, the statutory frameworks which set out their professional duties and responsibilities.
Key Tasks

The post holder will:

- Use excellent subject knowledge to teach the course content to a diverse pupil population.
- Teach high quality and relevant lessons to be delivered in line with the schools Teaching & Learning Policy.
- Suitably differentiate lessons to meet the needs of all pupils.
- Use technology to support engaging and exciting teaching.
- Plan lessons which match the full range of learners' needs.
- Use regular, thorough and accurate assessment that informs learners how to improve that will contribute to pupil progress.
- Plan and deliver well informed and engaging lessons according to the Rowan High School teaching and learning framework.
- Devise, implement, review and monitor IEPs for class pupils and to communicate contents to parents.
- Be responsible for the health and safety of pupils who are in your care.
- Manage the learning of pupils in a secure and friendly environment in which they can thrive.
- Use data to monitor and evidence pupil progress.
- Provide data on the progress of pupils taught and disseminate to all stakeholders.
- Ensure all pupils assigned make at least the expected level of progress due to high-quality teaching.
- Motivate, support and challenge pupils to ensure that they have positive attitudes to learning.
- Fulfil the role of a personal mentor as applicable.
- Contribute to extra-curricular provision.
- Maintain the equipment to ensure it is in working order for lessons/shows.
- Actively support the ethos of the school, ***'where pupils and students can reach their full potential'***.
- Always demonstrate professional characteristics with all stakeholders, colleagues, pupils and parents.
- Contribute to the school's continuous improvement.
- Work openly within the framework of best practice identified in the school safeguarding policy.
- Report any concerns regarding pupil safety or staff working practices to the designated CP officer(s).
- Keep up to date with local and national CPD training and training requirements.
- Support and take part in coaching/mentoring programmes to develop self and others.
- Attend meetings and professional development activities as required.
- Supervise and direct the work of Teaching Assistants assigned within your class.
- Work in partnership with classroom support staff, involving them in planning and evaluation in line with the school code of conduct.
- Facilitate any transition within or outside school.
- Work across both sites (Rowan High/Park School) when needed.
- Carry out any other task required by the headteacher that is reasonable and possible within directed time.

Safeguarding
